


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# How we work – Enterprise and Innovation? (2)

  - Strategic Projects: ESIF funding for SME engagement and London-wide business support services
  - Tenant Community: managing 3 'innovation hubs' with 90+ companies, linkages to LSB - Enterprise
  - Entrepreneurship and Innovation: student and graduate enterprise;
     SME internships and student consultancy
- All underpinned by a systems and compliance team which manages policies, processes and reporting.



# LSBU's Approach to Innovation Districts

 Currently operates three centres in which tenant companies are 'housed' in our quasi 'science and innovation park' community:

- 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of Technopark building (21,500 sq.ft),
- Blackwells on London Road (6,000 sq.ft), and
- part of the Clarence Centre (10,000 sq.ft).
- Across the three sites there is circa 90 established companies running their operations and turning over £152m







# The Clarence Centre – Central Hub

 The Clarence Centre is also home to the University's Research, Enterprise and Innovation (REI) team who provide the structures for staff, students, alumni and the external community to access the University's services, facilities and applied knowledge for the proposes of research and innovation.

The REI team works with over 688 external businesses; generated over £12.5m in funding through external collaborations and delivered nearly 20,000 hours of enterprise learning to businesses, 6,000 hours to students / graduates with 5,000+ headcount participation.

 The Clarence Centre is truly at the heart of a community of start-ups, student and graduate entrepreneurs, SMEs and LSBU's Research, Enterprise and Innovation Team. More than 1:5 LSBU alumni running their own business.

# **The Clarence Centre Services**

- The Clarence Centre addresses a variety of needs for both LSBU and the external community within which it operates, broadly speaking the 'offer', which reaches out to our own staff, students, alumni as well as the local community, covers 4 main areas:
  - Raising awareness of enterprise and entrepreneurship through a variety of talks, events and resources.
  - Developing an entrepreneurial mindset through boot camps, competitions and challenges and specific 1-2-1 advice.
  - Specific support for the start-up of new businesses through dedicated start-up programmes ranging from 3 months to 12 months
  - Wrap-around' businesses support services delivered using LSBU's own facilities and academic expertise coupled with external practitioners to support business growth; wealth generation and job creation

# **The Clarence Centre Physical Space**

 In terms of the physical infrastructure the Clarence Centre operates a 'zoned' approach to addressing the needs of entrepreneurs and SMEs at different stages of their entrepreneurial journey:

- Students with ideas access hot-desking facilities where they are co-locating with fellow entrepreneurs and the space provides an opportunity to share ideas and collaborate
- Graduates entrepreneurs, enrolled on the Graduate Entrepreneur Scheme, have access to dedicated, permanent office space – supported generously by Dr. Rami Ranger CBE
- Established businesses have access to both affordable, serviced office accommodation and specialist retail units opening up on to public pathways

- staff, students; graduates; tenants and the local community without the need to have a University enabled pass:
  - Dedicated conference and events facilities
  - A Legal Advice Clinic which offers free legal advice from LSBU students supervised by academics

Alongside these 'zones' we provide facilities that are accessible to

- The Business Solutions Centre which offers free business advice from LSBU students supervised by School of Business academics and the Research, Enterprise and Innovation team
- A courtyard offering communal space for work and pleasure.
- The Barista and Baker café providing informal meeting spaces for the local community and entrepreneurs.
